MISSION



Conversation Four Mission

(This conversation may need to be completed over two meetings.)

Welcome

God is manifest in the day-to-day ordinary and extra-ordinary experiences of our lives. If you are willing, briefly share a happening or insight from life during the past month.

Prayer

Light a lantern and enter into prayerful meditation.

Leader (Pause after reading and read a second time)

Jesus at Nazareth: He came to Nazareth where he had been brought up, and went into the synagogue on the sabbath day as he usually did. He stood up to read, and they handed him the scroll of the prophet Isaiah. Unrolling the scroll he found the place where it is written:

> "The spirit of the Lord has been given to me for God has anointed me. God has sent me to bring the good news to the poor, to proclaim liberty to captives and to the blind new sight, to set the downtrodden free, to proclaim the Lord's year of favour."

He then rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the assistant and sat down. And all eyes in the synagogue were fixed on him. Then he began to speak to them, "This text is being fulfilled today even as you listen." (Luke 4:16-21)

Brief Silence

"If I could be of service in saving souls in any part of the world, I would willingly do all in my power." (Letter 1)

These well-known words of Nano were written in 1769, some twenty years after she had begun work in Cork. Although it was the needs of her own people which had first drawn Nano to a life of apostolic service, the local scene alone could not contain her enthusiasm for the spread of the Gospel. For her the whole world mattered. (Fire on Earth, page 95)

Ouiet Reflection

What did Jesus see as the mission? What did Nano see as her mission?

Do you think it would be different if Jesus/Nano were speaking to us today?

Mission and Ministry

Definition of Mission

All Christian life is rooted in mission, the mission of Jesus, which is the manifestation of God's love for all of creation. Often this call to mission is referred to as participation in the coming of the Kingdom of God or the bringing of new life and hope to the world. Mission is not always the same as ministry. While mission can be or include a specific action or ministry, it is more of a call to bring alive the values of love, justice, compassion and liberation by the witness of our lives of prayer and community. The common call to mission is broad, with Baptism as the foundation. As the People of God grow in their understanding of this call, there is within persons a movement of God's Spirit to seek God's guidance for living out this call. Mission is the vocation to live in the pattern of Jesus who calls us to transform the world. A world that prefers peace to war, producing to consuming, empowering to controlling, sharing to possessing, community to individualism. (2014 Associate Orientation Manual)

Definition of Ministry

Ministry is the specific manner in which we carry out the mission. The Sisters of the Presentation receive our apostolic identity from Nano Nagle, our foundress.

Since coming to Dubuque in 1874, Presentation Sisters have focused ministry efforts on meeting unmet needs. The initial need was for education. Our ministry still has its roots in teaching: however, today, our educational ministry reflects less traditional forms. A common thread that runs through all ministry efforts is a desire to joyfully go where need calls most loudly. (Sisters of the Presentation website)

Dubuque Presentation Mission Statement

Sharing of Ministries

Presentation Sisters and associates share in the mission of Nano Nagle as they minister to a broken world offering hope and hospitality to all they encounter in this time in history.

Presentation Sisters and associates incarnate hospitality of God in the world as they work to change unjust systems by working on behalf of the poor and women and children and advocating for racial equity and immigration reform. Some sisters and associates minister in direct service to those made poor. Some sisters serve as justice advocates for immigrants, the poor and the homeless, educators, parish ministers, spiritual directors, social workers, pastoral care workers and healthcare workers. Associates live the Presentation mission through their life style in their families, work places, parishes and communities. Some associates engage in promise groups that carry out the commitments. Sisters and associates partner for mission because we are better together.

Read Together

Jesus, light to the world, flaring forth of the divine among us, you embody the spirit poured into the whole creation from the beginning. May your spirit, alive in us now, flare forth to empower us to live as your beloved children. May we be signs of your love as we, like Nano and Mother Vincent, take up our lanterns and move one pace beyond. Amen
